Besides their rousing Irish and New England tunes, Reel Friends will share some holiday tunes that everyone is encouraged to sing along. A highlight of the evening is an amazing potluck dessert. The dance begins at 7PM and ends at 10PM. It is held at the East Spokane Grange hall, 1621 N. Park Rd in the Spokane Valley.

Not So But Far Otherwise - Countercurrent

A Band and Album Review by Penn Fix

With the holidays in mind, Countercurrent's newest album *Not So But Far Otherwise* provides happy and genuinely played tunes and songs by one of the Northwest's best contra dance bands. Brian Lindsay and Alex Sturbaum have been playing together since their Oberlin College days.



Their newest effort reflects how strongly they connect with one another both in tunes and songs. For those seeking dance tunes, this album features several sets that Countercurrent play regularly for dances. Master Crowley's and Asturian Way showcase the breadth of the band; they honor traditional tunes like Master Crowley's; and they match it with a contemporary one like Asturian Way; then they add their own mastery of fiddle and guitar to create a driving dance set. Cats in the Henhouse (by Alex Sturbaum), Free Little Bird and A Fair Wind set Countercurrent apart from most contradance bands: they sing as dancers dance. As Alex noted, "we love the optimistic and carefree feeling the set evokes when we sing it for contra dances."

Besides dance sets, *Not So But Far Otherwise* highlights the distinct and lovely voices of Brian and Alex

through several diverse songs drawn from the contemporary landscape, though entrenched in tradition. The two waltzes demonstrate their spirit of sharing and respecting one another. Alex chose Augusta Waltz (Bob McQuillen) played at their wedding; and Brian, Two Rivers (Larry Unger) is his "favorite waltz of all time."

Not So But Far Otherwise reflects a two year effort by two amazing musicians partnered in the joy of engaging with themselves and their community. The album is \$20 and available at www.countercurrentmusic.bandcamp.com/album/not-so-but-far-otherwise
